

Father Scott's Sharing Spot

A Message from Father Scott VanDerveer, Pastor at St. Mary's Church



Dear Parish Family,

As you read in last week's Sharing Spot, Pope Francis has challenged Catholic parishes around the world to invigorate and reimagine the way parish Pastoral Councils work in light of the worldwide Synod that got input from a billion Catholics about what ways from their vantage point they see and feel the Holy Spirit at work in the Church.

The concept of a Parish Council came more than 50 years ago with the renewed understanding of Vatican II that every Catholic was on a spiritual path, not just the clergy. Each person's baptism gave them an invitation and responsibility to take an active role in their faith. So the work of a vibrant parish was not just for the clergy to accomplish, but for everyone who is baptized into this faith.

Over time, in some instances, certain parish councils devolved into being almost like a board of directors for the parish, where a few invested people wound up making a lot of decisions around a boardroom table with the pastor. (You could picture how that could make an amusing backdrop for episodes of a sitcom on parish life.)

Over the course of decades these groups evolved into something much more suited to letting God lead the discussion: what we know today as the "Pastoral Council." The difference in this model from the parish council is that the Holy Spirit is in charge of presenting the pastor, through prayer, with the issues that are most in need of consultation. This way, the most difficult puzzles that the parish and community face are presented to the Council, making it much more like a discernment group than a board meeting. It also makes it clear that the group is advisory and consultative, and not like a board of elders in a Protestant church. Big improvement! Still, this means that same 8- 12 people are regularly being consulted, which can wind up getting circular and siloed.

After hearing the Pope's challenge to reimagine this process, at one staff brainstorming session last year it occurred to us to go out to the small groups with a list of questions in the style of those that were asked at the Synod and include not just a dozen people around a table but expand that to include a hundred or more people in the process.

It wound up working so well, we decided to enlist Alison, Ben, Gary, Amanda, Judy and our parish trustees to once again split up the list of small groups and over the course of the a week earlier this month go with clipboards, notepads, pens and open ears to listen to nearly 100 St. Mary's parishioners share their responses to three questions.

- (1) What keeps you at St. Mary's?
- (2) What do you need from a parish that you're not getting here?
- (3) For three years Fr. Scott has said that donating 5% of our income is what it takes to have a vibrant parish. What is standing in the way of every parishioner giving at that level?

What we heard gave us a lot of input to mull over. On February 18, we plan to take the pages of notes from listening to parishioners in small group sessions and organize them into themes. These in these themes we will look for patterns and echoes and begin to see what possibilities might be calling us to devote our energy and attention.

Our experience of this version of pastoral consultation filled our minds with fresh ideas and stirred our hearts. In a future Sharing Spot, I will share with you some of the particulars that came out of the small group suggestions once we have a chance to process and organize the responses.

Thank you to all the Small Group members for your candor, your creativity and for the love you have for God and for St. Mary's.




